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Dear Parents/Carers,

On **Tuesday 8th February** we will be joining schools and youth organisations across the UK in celebrating **Safer Internet Day 2022**. Safer Internet Day is a global campaign to promote the safe and responsible use of technology, which calls on young people, parents, carers, teachers, social workers, law enforcement, companies, policymakers and more, to join together in helping to create a better internet.

Using the internet safely and positively is a key message that we promote at Witton Church Walk Primary School, and celebrating Safer Internet Day is a great opportunity for us to re-emphasise the online safety messages that we deliver throughout the year.

Each year in the UK, Safer Internet Day explores a new issue or theme which is impacting the lives of young people in the UK. This year, the day celebrates young people's role in creating a safer internet and the ways in which they are shaping the interactive environment spaces they are a part of. It focuses on **challenging children to foster supportive relationships and respectful communities, whilst equipping them with the skills they need to keep themselves and others safe in these spaces**. During our e-safety day work at school, the children will be exploring, discussing and reflecting on what constitutes respectful behaviour online and what to do if they encounter unkind behaviours directed towards themselves or others.

We would be delighted if you could join us in celebrating the day by continuing your child's learning and conversations around online safety at home. **This year, we are asking that you complete a family online safety plan with all members of your households, to engage in discussions about how we can all work together, as a community, to keep our families safe and happy online.** Your child/children will be coming home with a copy of the online safety plan which can be completed at a time appropriate to yourselves. It will be beneficial to keep this document in a safe place at home, acting as a reminder to be reflected upon and discussed at various points throughout the year, as and when you see appropriate. **We would love to share in the plans that you complete at home as a family, so please remember to tweet**
