


Perseverance- RE Wheel



Suggested Activities:

Listen– Listen to the words in this song. It talks about being strong and faithful – who is strong and important in your life, helping you in difficult times? Could you share this song with them and let them know how special they are to you? If they don't live in your house maybe you could text or email the link to them, or play it to them over a virtual meeting site...

Watch– Watch the video of Noah's Ark. In the Bible story, God gave Noah a very difficult task. How did Noah succeed? Think about a time when you have had to persevere in a task– what did you do? What was difficult? How did you overcome this?

Observe– Look at the painting, titled 'The fruit of perseverance'. What do you like about it? Why might the artist have represented it like this? Think about colour, texture, materials used etc.

Create– Make your own 'Fruit of perseverance' picture. Click on the links for ideas, by the artist Enrique Zaldivar, on creating an abstract painting or collage

Read- Read the quote. What does the quote mean to you? Can you relate it to how the world today is due to the current situation?

Respond– Think of a situation where you know you will need to show some perseverance in order to achieve it. Identify some small steps you could try to help you to achieve your target. Why don't you draw around your hand and pop your target in the centre and your small steps in each of the fingers?

Keep it somewhere safe and this helping hand will serve to remind you of how to persevere to achieve!

Think- Read the quote from Daniel. You might also like to watch the story of Daniel by clicking on the link. Do you have any worries and stresses that you need to share with God today? Write a prayer to help you to share them.

Reflect– Read and reflect on the bible quotes. Create your own quote about perseverance, which might help others in our school community.
